



Openness to Technological Solutions

- Increased appreciation that functions and tasks can be done on-line
 - Video teaching
 - Blended learning
- Technology supporting better inclusiveness
 & universal design
 - Built in learning tools
 - Captions and transcriptions
- Within teams improved efficiencies, connections and collaboration
 - Equality for dispersed team members
 - Virtual catch ups

"Our intrastate teammates really appreciated the sudden equality and felt they could for the first time participate on an equal basis in team discussions. "



Addressing Accessibility

- More consideration and appreciation of access issues
- More flexibility than usual to address these

Inclusive Teaching and Learning

- Alternative Assessments
 - End of semester exam alternatives
 - Range of alternatives that benefit many students

- Greater involvement
 - From across the tertiary institution

Flexible Work Arrangements

- Working from Home
 - Better work/home balance
 - Less travel
 - Confidence it can be done successfully
- Contact with students
 - Outside of the 9 5pm windows
 - Some students appreciated on-line or phone appointments
- Hopes for the Future
 - Blend of home and office-based

"Professional staff should have the option to WFH. It should be outcomes driven and not "people in the office" approach as we have already demonstrated that it can be done."



Connections, Compassion, & Creativity

- Academics more willing to engage and support
- Compassion became a baseline for decision making
- Creativity to continually work towards best possible solutions
- Greater collaboration across institutions and sector to get things done
