#### Socialeyes

#### A social skills development resource

- developed by people with autism and leading professionals (National Autistic Society, London in 2010)
- does not ask people with autism to change 'inappropriate' social behaviour, or to copy the 'typical' behaviour of others
- provides the option of learning social interaction skills or alternative social strategies
- uses filmed social scenarios to analyse the unwritten rules of social behaviour in detail and facilitates video-modelling

## Feedback from participants

- This helps me engage with people in more ways
- Coming to the group helps me feel normalised
- Environment is good, better than an office or medical centre.
  This environment improves communications and reduces "threshold fear"
