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Challenges of Equity Practitioners

Anecdotally feedback indicates that there is a significant gap between the formal process of acknowledging and developing an Access Plan for potential support and then what happens in practice when an educator receives that plan.

Jumping Gaps is risky!

What gaps are appearing in Educator understanding?

Why a Call to Arms?

- Improve correlation between equity practitioners and educators when responding to Access Plans
- Build educator capability with student conversations on inherent requirements and reasonable adjustments
- Streamline organisational processes
- Create a national model –National Training packages
- Strengthen student voice and self-advocacy

Systemic Challenges

- DDA and Disability Standards for Education unfamiliarity
- Access Plans requiring disclosure
- Training Packages not always written inclusively
- Funding models differ between States/Territories

Stakeholder Challenges

- Limited VET guidance / professional learning resources
- Low levels of awareness /understanding about:
 - Impacts of Disability on participation/learning
 - Reasonable adjustment
- Inconsistent implementation of Accessibility Plans
 - Locally
 - Sector-wide
